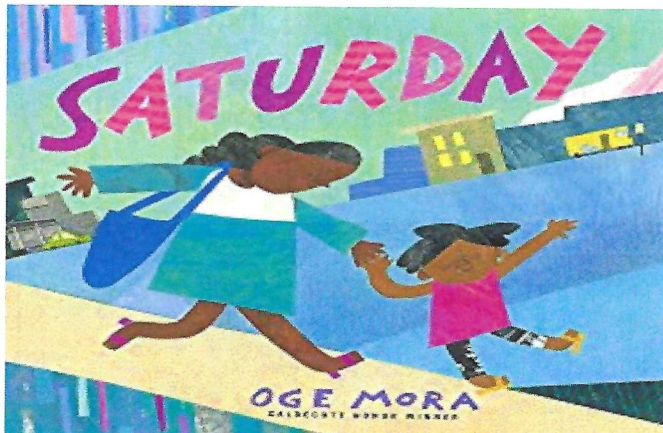

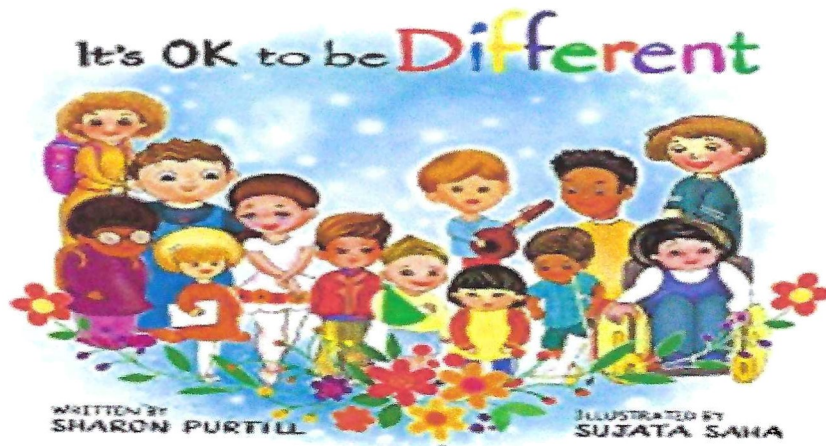
Here some ideas to do with your children at home:

Reading: Google books video in You tube



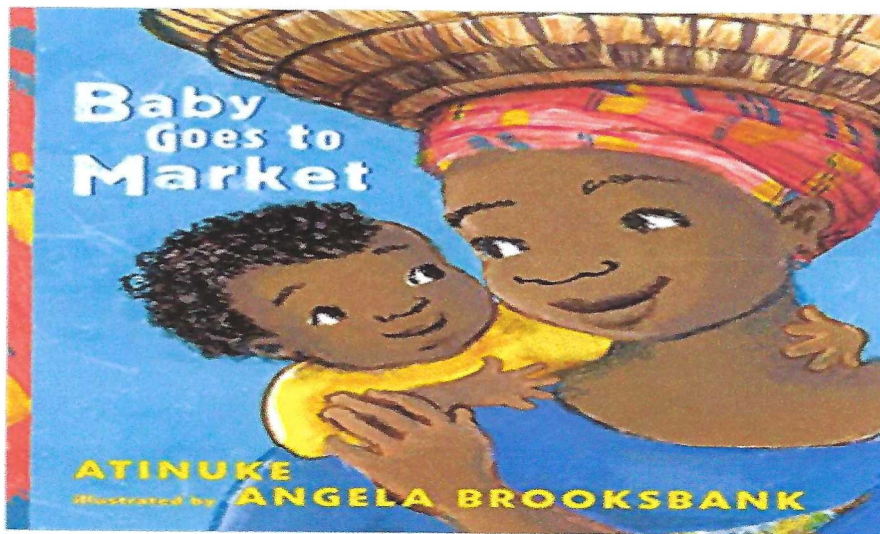
For ages 3 & up

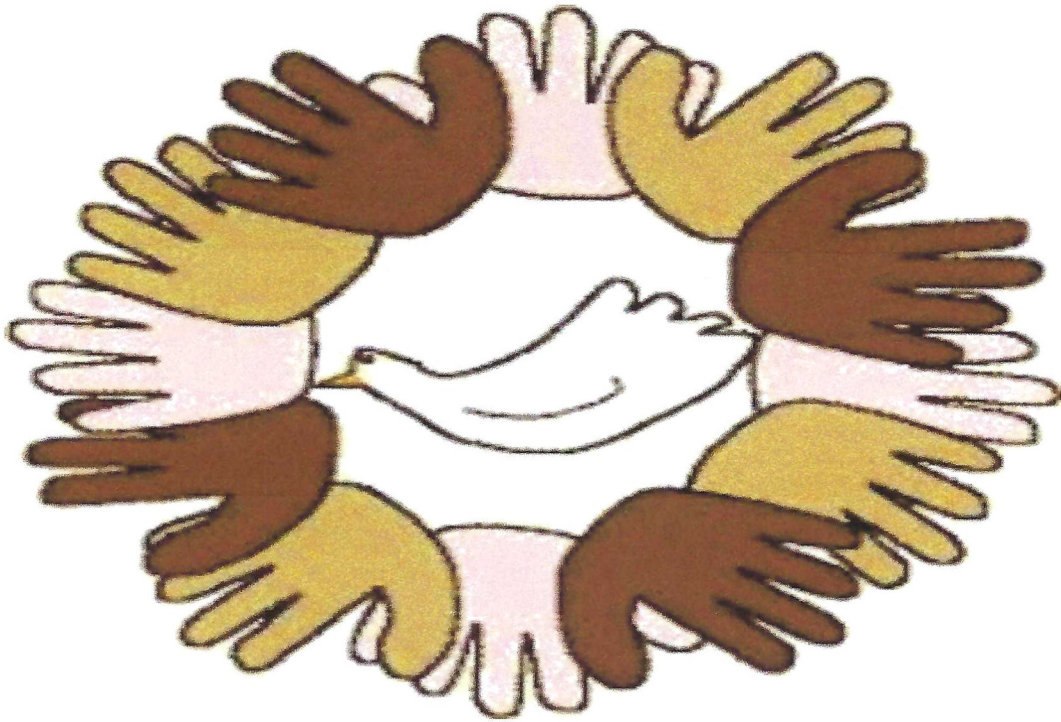
